



Student Advisory Committee Charter Document

Purpose:

- To provide opportunities for high-performing students to become involved with KEF in a non-binding advisory role.
- To identify and cultivate future leaders of KEF, Koniag, Inc., and associated businesses.
- To foster student engagement with KEF programs and provide a way to continue engagement beyond culmination of a student's program of study.
- To increase affiliation with KEF, forming a basis for development work.
- Other tasks as assigned by the KEF Board of Directors.

Requirements:

To maintain active status and eligibility on the committee, members must:¹

- Be in good academic standing.
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA.
- Be actively enrolled in two classes.
- Provide transcripts in a timely fashion.
- Communicate with KEF staff.
- Communicate absences to Chair prior to scheduled meetings.²

Structure:

- Comprised of five to six (5-6) individuals having received a KEF Scholarship within the preceding year.
- A majority of the Committee membership shall reside in Alaska.
- A Chair and Vice-Chair of Committee to be selected by Committee members.
- Selection of Committee members to be made by Development Committee.
- Seats on Committee are for a one-year term; students must reapply annually.
- Student member is limited to three (3) years on the Committee.
- Body to meet monthly at KEF's Anchorage office for conducting Committee business. KEF staff (Program Manager) will support the ongoing work of Committee by compiling minutes and attendance.
- Student Advisory Committee to report to Development Committee, with potential to report and attend portions of the KEF Regular Board Meetings in a non-voting capacity, as directed by KEF Board of Directors.

¹ Refusal to abide by any of the requirements is cause for dismissal.

² Non-attendance in two (2) consecutive meetings will result in cause for dismissal.
