What is FERPA and to which entities does it apply? FERPA is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records and gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records, including the right to inspect and review them. Under FERPA, a parent generally must provide a signed and dated written consent before a school discloses personally identifiable information (PII) from the student's education records. 34 CFR § 99.30. The rights accorded to, and the consent required of, parents under FERPA transfer from the parents to the student when the student becomes an eligible student. 34 CFR § 99.5. An "eligible student" is a student who has reached the age of 18 or is attending a postsecondary institution at any age. 34 CFR § 99.3 (definition of "Eligible student"). FERPA directly applies to all educational agencies and institutions that receive funds under any program administered by the Secretary of Education ("Department"). In general, when we refer to "local educational agencies" (LEAs) or "schools," we mean "educational agencies and institutions" that are subject to FERPA.
